


Increased attention to Social impacts in Supply Chains

Many industrial disasters, such as the **Bhopal gas leak** and the **Erika oil tanker** disaster, demonstrated that voluntary due diligence is not efficient. Consequently, human rights issues are being dealt with by global regulations such as **G7**, **OECD**, and **UN/UNGP**. Their main objective is to ensure that corporations, including their entire supply chains, prevent or mitigate negative impacts from their operations, products and services.

This means corporation must undertake human rights due diligence in the operation of their entire supply chain, including subsidiaries, subcontractors and suppliers worldwide. In 2017, the French Parliament adopted a **new law** that imposes due diligence on multinationals' human rights abuses in supply chains. The UK introduced the **Modern Slavery Act** of 2015, and more countries such as Germany will soon step in.

Many corporations lacking expertise to face these growing regulatory restrictions are exposed to significant reputational risks. In some complex industries, such as **chemical** and **consumer goods**, the only realistic, pragmatic answer is collaboration among competitors through sectorial initiatives.
